Pentecost Sunday is June 4th, sometimes called the birthday of the Christian church. Some 2000 years ago, the Holy Spirit moved through the disciples with the sound of wind and the appearance of fire. As they boldly began to share the Gospel, many responded in faith, and the church as we know it began.

Birthdays are awkward things. They mean different things to different people at different stages of their development. When we're young we cannot help but look forward to new experiences and new opportunities. When we get older we often become more resistant to change. Memories of past events start to take on higher, almost sacred value. We might even reminisce about the "good old days" that weren't necessarily all that good, but that the passage of time always seems to edit in a positive light.

So what does Pentecost - the birthday of the church - represent for us? A reason to look back with nostalgia? Or an opportunity to look forward and set our sights on the horizon where the Holy Spirit offers a future filled with new challenges and opportunities along with the very power and presence of God? Perhaps both.

This year is the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, also an appropriate time for Lutherans to look back as well as ahead. We've come a long way empowered by a Holy Spirit that is not a domesticated, tame, or quiet Spirit. This Spirit of God shakes things up, tears down old ideas, and emboldens new initiatives. It causes some old ways of thinking and doing to "die" and other new ones to "arise." That should not be surprising, since the church has always been both "dying" & "rising" to new life, often at the same time.

Some are already writing the obituary for the church. They say it's dying. They cite how some churches are struggling. Membership, giving, and attendance are down across the board, among mainline churches and evangelicals alike. Many young people, who have a remarkable ability of smelling B.S. a mile away, are avoiding so-called "organized religion" like the plague. They paint a very discouraging picture.

I suspect their assessment is premature. First of all, those purveyors of doom and gloom do not take into account the persistence of the Holy Spirit, a serious miscalculation. They also overlook places like Good Shepherd where the Gospel is routinely proclaimed both in word and deed and where people's needs are met with generosity and passion. This church is still growing. Change is still happening, just not in places and ways that many expect.

Yes, change is in the wind, but I believe that it is the wind of the Spirit blowing through the life of the church. Yes, we have work to do, but I believe that good things are ahead of us. We can trust God in that.

Your Council has been focused on the future of our Church. We are currently studying the book, *The Agile Church*, by Dwight Zscheile, a professor at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN. Our focus is to think about our Church as an end to be preserved and move toward reconceiving the Church as a result of our faithfulness to the mission of God.

The WHIRL process continues to evolve, with much progress being made in the

Healing ministry, Involvement, Relationships and Leadership areas. We will be commissioning three new leaders in the Stephen ministry program, helping to reinforce a new start in our Healing area. Please look around the narthex, as the Involvement team has a new display, helping members to find areas to "plug into" here at Good Shepherd. Our Leadership Development committee is working with the standing committees of the church on developing plans for succession of leadership. I continue to be pleased with our progress, now one year since the Congregational Survey helped kick off the process. I'm grateful to the leadership of Glenn Kraft in moving this work forward for Good Shepherd.

We continue to work on the establishment of the core team for the Capital Campaign. We are recruiting team members to assist with the campaign, and refining the project list for both costs and rationale for each project. The recent failure of the HVAC system serving the overflow area of the Sanctuary reinforces the need to establish a long-term maintenance and funding plan, as identified by the feasibility study. The system is being replaced, as we do have a small capital maintenance fund that can bear that cost (\$15,000). However, it will bring the total in that fund down by approximately 45%.

As we continue to focus on our mission, I'm struck by how our Church continues to have a "small church feel." We are a warm and welcoming congregation. However, Good Shepherd is a large congregation. Consider that the median worshipping size for Lutheran churches is 86, and the average ELCA congregation worships with 131.4 saints of God on a given Sunday. We are averaging about 500 worshippers on any given Sunday, more than four times the average. Our size puts us in the top 2.5% of all ELCA congregations! As we continue to grow, it is our prayer that we keep that small congregation feel, while worshipping many more members while we are Following Christ, Growing in Faith, Sharing God's Love.

It is with great excitement that I have accepted the opportunity to serve as a Young Adult in Global Mission (YAGM) volunteer in Madagascar starting in August 2017. I will be one of more than 85 young adults serving on behalf of the ELCA in 11 different country programs around the world!



Bet you are wondering how this all happened, so let us go back a few years. I was raised by wonderful parents who brought me to church and showed me the world. They made me ask the big questions in life and form my own views. They took me to church every Sunday. I literally grew up at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church with our mission statement of: Following Christ, Growing in Faith, Sharing God's Love. That has been my motto for how I live my life. All of my actions are shaped by my faith. My understanding of the world was created not only by my faith, but by my travels. I remember every summer packing up our van and heading out with our camping gear. I was blessed to see the United States with my own eyes. Soon this love for travel led beyond the United States. I began going on mission trips with church, studying abroad in college, and going on a medical mission trip. All these things were stepping stones.

Little did I know as a kid that I would get a degree in nursing and have a passion for global mission. I have always felt that God was calling me for something unique in my life. My goal has always been to combine my passion for nursing, love for travel, and faith into one amazing experience. When I was told to look into YAGM, my heart was overjoyed by what I found. Everything fit with how I was feeling about the mission work I wanted to be participating in. God has blessed me with a nursing degree and over 4 years of learning in a major hospital. I feel like I am being called to put my skills to use in another place.

The total cost for one young adult's year of service is \$15,000. As part of accepting this call, I am asked to raise support for my year of service, and I am hoping to be able to raise the full amount. Yes, this seems like a lot of money, but even the smallest gift can make a difference. For as little as \$41, you can support one day on my journey. Through your donation, you join me on this journey as I grow in my own faith and walk in partnership with our global companions.

50 states and 22 countries later, I find myself taking another journey. Living in Madagascar for a year! I can't wait to see where God is leading me.



The Service Team helps to organize many service-related activities within the church and one of those has been the "Baby Shower,".We are very grateful for your overwhelming support and generosity with this endeavor. Our next project will be a "Thank You" of sorts for our soldiers as they pass through the USO at St. Louis Lambert Airport with some personal care items.The items they have requested are: toothpaste, shaving cream,mouthwash (ALL TRAVEL SIZE, PLEASE), razors and Kleenex individual packs.

One of the agencies we supported was Our Lady's Inn. This organization provides a loving home and an array of services supporting pregnant women and their children suffering with homelessness. For more than 35 years families have been sheltered and supported in their efforts to live healthy and productive lives, attain educational goals, gain employment and secure stable housing.



The Welcome Ministry Team helps promote a friendly, inclusive and supportive atmosphere for members and visitors. In May we helped the WHIRL Involvement planning team kickoff and "Interests Connect Us" effort to help members find out about and join various groups, ministries and activities.



The WHIRL Involvement Team identified 118 Good Shepherd groups and activities that involve our members. These opportunities include Bible studies, educational programs, musical groups, service and support ministries, fellowship and recreational activities, worship assistance, leadership, and facilities & grounds. These are

participation activities and do not include worship services, concerts or other events. A few groups are full because members are elected, e.g., Council or Audit Committee, or because they are the right size, e.g., small groups that have developed strong, long-term interpersonal relationships.

A reference copy can be found in the 3-ring binder (with the pictorial directory) at the information table near the coffee pots.
