Welcome Home Good Shepherd! In-Person Worship Begins: April 18

We are thrilled to finally gather for in-person worship in our sanctuary again! This has been a long and difficult season, but we have learned that we continue to be the Church, the hands and feet of Jesus, no matter where or how we worship. As you prepare to return to worship at Good Shepherd, we want to share how we have prepared to keep one another safe and what to expect when you come. Worship will look and feel a bit different when you return. We will not have gathering in the narthex, shake hands, or have a building full of kids in Sunday school yet, but worship with our gathered community will still be a beautiful thing!

Pre-Registration

- We ask that everyone who would like to attend worship **sign up in advance**. This will help us ensure we are abiding by capacity guidelines (100 people per service), allowing ample space to socially distance from those outside your household, and have an accurate list of attendees in case there is ever a need for contact tracing.
- Online sign up is preferred, via the **mobile app** or ([Online Registration](https://www.tpsdb.com) ([tpsdb.com](https://www.tpsdb.com))) If you need assistance, however, please call **Brenda Ogroski** in the

church office, (636-391-6685).

Worship Times

- We will begin with two worship services at **9:00 (traditional)** and **11:00 (contemporary)**.
- Worship will be livestreamed at 9:00 and 11:00. Online worship will be available anytime after the livestream on Facebook, Youtube, Vimeo, or our Website goodshepherdlutheran.com.

Communion

- At first, we will use pre-packaged, individual elements for Holy Communion. These can be picked up as you enter the Sanctuary.
- Since worship will be live-streamed, you are welcome to participate in Holy Communion if you are worshipping at home, providing your own elements.

Music

- We will have music during worship, but singing is not encouraged at this time. We invite you to hum along or reflect on the words.

Other Worship Components

- We will not pass baskets for offering, but have a box available in the Narthex.
- We will not use bulletins or hymnals at first, as it would be extremely difficult to sanitize. For now, we will utilize screens for worship.
- We will share peace through waving or saying hello, but not shaking hands.

Safety

- We will wear **masks** to protect one another. Even those that have been vaccinated will wear masks, as the virus may be able to spread after vaccination. (Children under age 2 should not be masked)
- **We will not serve coffee**, and ask that no food or beverages come into the building for worship.
- You will be asked to **socially distance** from others not in your household.
- **We will not congregate in the Narthex** before or after worship, but invite you to have fellowship outdoors!

Preparation & Sanitation

- The church facilities are thoroughly cleaned and sanitized by our expert cleaning staff each week, and high-touch surfaces will be sanitized between services.
- Airflow has been increased and filters have been upgraded in our HVAC system.
- Pews will be marked to facilitate social distancing.

FAQ's

Will two worship services be enough?

- We anticipate that beginning with two services will allow ample capacity for those who desire to worship in-person at first, and this also helps make sanitizing and staffing volunteer needs more manageable. We will be prepared to add additional worship times when needed.
- The online registration form has a waitlist available if we reach capacity for a given service.

Can Lutherans still have worship if coffee and donuts are not served?

- Yes. While it may seem like a biblical mandate, coffee is, in fact, not mentioned

anywhere in the Bible or the Book of Concord.

- We highly recommend bringing high-quality travel mug in your car so you can have coffee on the way, and it will be waiting for you in your car right after worship!

Will there be Sunday School or Nursery?

- We will not offer in-person Sunday School for the remainder of the spring. We encourage you to continue utilizing our Family Faith Formation at Home ministry for the remainder of the school year.
- We will not offer nursery care at this time, but children are very much welcome in worship!



Feed My Starving Children Giving Challenge

For Lent, we took on the challenge to feed 120 children for one whole year. Through your generosity, we have raised enough to feed 103 children so far. And we are continuing the challenge through April 18th. The initial goal was 120 kids, but let's see how many more lives we can touch. For only \$88 you will feed a child a nutritious meal a day for one whole year.
