Future Worship Plans

Our worship life was completely changed in the spring of 2020. Since that time, we have been adapting, being creative, and adapting again as the waves of the pandemic have moved through our world. **I thank you from the bottom of my heart for your support, flexibility, and grace as we have navigated this incredibly difficult road.** As Christians, we are called to love God and love our neighbors. As Luther says, "A Christian is a perfectly free lord of all, subject to none. A Christian is a perfectly dutiful servant of all, subject of all, subject to all." You have embodied this faithfully, and I am so, so proud of Good Shepherd!

We are at a juncture where we do not yet know what the future holds, thus what the needs of our community will be for worship. Yet we are also at a juncture where we can and should make some firm plans for at least the next season. Staff and Council have been discussing the future of worship and what is needed to best help us fulfill the mission God has given us.

In normal times, we would invite a longer and more broad conversation about our communal worship life. However, with the uncertainty before us, current and expected participation trends, and the ministry God has given us, Council and staff feel that committing to **two Sunday morning worship services (9:00 & 11:00) with an education hour in between (10:00) will be the most effective and fruitful plan for ministry.** This is not forever, but a trial for the next season. We will evaluate along the way, and invite you join us in trying out this 'new normal' until such a time as our needs may warrant an additional or different worship services.

Key Factors in the Decision

We cannot return to four worship services.

- Prior to the pandemic, our weekly attendance did not require four worship service times. (There was a time, about 15 years ago, when weekly worship attendance did require this).
- Even prior to the pandemic, four services were incredibly difficult to sustain. The staff time and energy, and volunteer needs required was very demanding.
- Online Worship is an additional opportunity that will continue.
- Fewer worship services will free up time, energy, and resources (both people and material) to invest in our mission.

We should commit to a consistent Sunday schedule for the fall.

- For the sake of Children’s Ministry, Adult Education and other planning needs.
- For the sake of stability and predictability for all of us *and* for new people.

Faith Formation in kids is most effective when Sunday School *is not* concurrent with Worship

- We see an increasing trend of kids not attending worship. If they do not attend as kids, they generally do not attend when older and drift away from the Church.
- Worship is richer and more complete when the whole body of Christ is present.

Key Recommendation

Sunday Morning Schedule: 9:00 Worship - 10:00 Education Hour - 11:00 Worship

Positives:

- We believe this will enable more participation of kids in worship.
- We believe this will enable more adults to participate in Children’s Ministry, thus better fulfilling our mission of raising kids as disciples and supporting families.
- We believe this will open more opportunities for learning, community, and faith formation for all members.
- Moving to two, rather than three services frees up more energy, time, and

resources in other ministry areas.

Challenges:

- We recognize a tighter education window of time will be an adjustment.
- We recognize that there is loss for those who valued the 8:00 and 5:30 worship, time, style, and community. We would seek to incorporate some of what made these services special into 9:00 or 11:00 worship.
