The meals will be purchased in bulk by Wings of Love and Care in St. Louis. Angie Liggins (the program coordinator for Wings) and her crew of volunteers will pack and distribute all of these meals. They have an amazing process and setup for feeding and supporting the needy throughout the year.

Please help! We will be supporting 150 families again this year. Since everything will be purchased in bulk, just \$35 will provide a Thanksgiving meal for one family, \$70 for two families, and \$105 for three families.

Feed the Need STL - Feed My Starving Children

This is the story of Charles, the founder of Light Up Our Youth Foundation in Haiti. The foundation is a partner of Feed My Starving Children. Growing up as an orphan in Haiti, Charles ate MannaPack™ Rice at school, but he never knew where it came from. Years later, he was packing meals for Feed My Starving Children in Chicago. The moment he tasted the sample at the end of the session, he knew these were the same meals he ate as a child.



Charles was born in very poor village in Haiti. Orphaned at the age of 7, he lived on the streets of Port-au-Prince where he experienced starvation, poverty, and violence. The best part of his day was going to school where he was given a meal each day. Otherwise, he picked through trash cans for things to eat.

As a teenager Charles got the opportunity to live in the United States and to get an education. He went to school in the mornings and worked in the afternoons. After the 2010 earthquake in Haiti, he worked even harder to get an engineering degree. Ten days after graduation he went back to Haiti to help with the recovery effort working as a water resources engineer.

Charles encountered many starving and homeless children in the same community that he had lived in as an orphan. He established the Light Up Our Youth Foundation to help end the cycle of illiteracy and hunger. One child at a time, one block at a time. 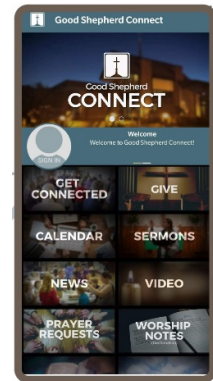
