### **Roller Coasters, Holy Spirit, and Food Trucks.**

As summer approaches we find ourselves with a mix of emotions. Many of us are feeling hope and joy, as life starts getting back to something closer to normal! Easter, confirmation, CGs and many of our ministries have been joyous celebrations. Yet, you may also feel this strange, contradictory sense of sadness or loss. Sound familiar? These days I find myself holding these intense feelings in tandem, swinging dramatically from one to the other at any given moment. Why?

My friends, it has been a hard season. *We have been through a lot.* The pandemic has thrust us into collective trauma. We are still feeling the aftershocks from it. Even if Covid did not directly affect you or your family, the tension, the uncertainty, the ever-changing recommendations and expectations robbed us of normalcy and stability. For us at Good Shepherd, the pandemic began immediately on the heels of our own collective struggle. 2019 was a difficult year for Good Shepherd. We adopted a Welcome Statement which has been a beautiful, guiding document that has brought us many new friends, but the road to get there was difficult. Some of us lost old friends. In our deep, faithful passion, many of us experienced hurt or perhaps unintentionally hurt others. When the pandemic came and prevented us from gathering, we lost the opportunity to celebrate or grieve, to heal or restore.

Now, when we look around there is SO much wonderful ministry happening at Good Shepherd... and yet so much feels different. So, we feel hope and joy, but then a wave of nostalgic lament may hit us out of nowhere.

When you take all of this, and add the war in Ukraine, economic worries, political divisions, and devastating mass shootings in Buffalo and Uvalde, is it any wonder our emotions are on a never-ending roller coaster! Anxiety is at an all-time high. ***You are not alone in this.*** I feel it. Others feel it. God feels it with us. Where do we go from here?

This summer, ministry will not be taking a vacation! We are going to dive into some intentional, prayerful work *together*. We will do three key things this summer.

1. **Re|Connect:** Have fun together and strengthen our sense of belonging.
2. **Reflect:** Engage everyone in conversation, reflecting on the past season, what we have learned, and how that informs our plans for the future.
3. **Discern:** Where is God leading us next and how do we best get there together?

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## **A "Wink" from the Welcome Ministry Team** **By Elliott Haugen**



Welcome to June! Hopefully, you will be attending some picnics, reunions or family gatherings during this and other summer months. And of course, we hope church is in your plans too. Isn't it wonderful when you show up for those events and someone greets you and is excited to see you? Our Welcome Team is asking you to provide a similar welcoming experience to the increasing number of people who are returning to or visiting Good Shepherd. We would appreciate you volunteering to be a greeter at the 9 am or 11 am worship services. Families can serve as greeters too.

Here's what you will need to know to provide this important welcoming service:

1. Pick a Sunday and time (9 or 11 am) to welcome at the north or east doors.
2. Sign up (see process below).
3. Arrive 15 minutes before worship and greet until a few minutes after the service starts.
4. Be prepared to use your best smile and to say "welcome to Good Shepherd", "glad you are here", "thanks for being with us today" or your own personal greeting.

It is easy to volunteer by using the Good Shepherd Connect App and selecting the "Serve" tab. Then select "Greeter" and

check available dates and times. (You can also volunteer to usher, read, assist with communion, or help with sound/video or altar guild.) If you need help using the Connect App, let Elliott know and he will connect you to someone who can help.

If you are not a Connect App user, please just let Elliott or Vicki Haugen know the date(s) and worship service (9 or 11) when you can help greet.

In total we have fed 20,459 children a meal a day for a year, and our meals were sent to 17 different countries around the world!
